Book Club à St Germain en laye

Four times per year there is an opportunity for pupils from Maternelle 3/Grande Section to 7ème/CM1 to order books and computer games through the *Fun Fare Book Club*. This important feature of our on-going concern to encourage reading for all ages and interests is organised by a team of Mums. It is an extremely popular activity and has also provided our classroom libraries with an additional in-put of new and exciting titles. We are able to choose from the catalogues a selection of free books equivalent to 10% of the total spent by the pupils.

Readathon

Each school year as part of our Reading Festival we participate in the Readathon campaign organised as part of Children's Book Week in the United Kingdom.

Our pupils, from Maternelle 3/Grande Section to 7ème/CM2 ask their Mums and Dads and other members of their family to sponsor them during a week in October. The pupils try to read as many books as they can and then collect a small sum from each sponsor for each book read. All this usually adds up to a considerable sum which we send off to the

Readathon organisation who invests it in the Malcolm Sargent Cancer Care for Children and the Roald Dahl Foundation which also assists victims of cancer and other illnesses.

Secondary Literature

After school Book Clubs for college-level pupils have been set up on all sites by library staff. This is a great chance for keen readers to share their enthusiasm for Literature with their peers.

Pupils who fancy themselves as budding journalists are invited to write articles for 'Student Shout', the pupil pages of the British Section magazine, *Insites*.
